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All submitted abstracts should contain substantive results, whether experimental, calculated, or theoretical.

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3. NYSCF Research Conduct Policy

Abstract submission constitutes a formal agreement and statement by the authors that they have conducted the reported research in accordance with applicable institutional and national guidelines and regulations regarding experiments on human subjects, live vertebrates, or higher invertebrates, including ISSCR policies on [Guidelines for the Conduct of Human Embryonic Stem Cell Research](#) and [Guidelines for the Clinical Translation of Stem Cells](#). Abstracts reporting any experimental work that was not conducted in accordance with these guidelines will be rejected by the NYSCF Program Committee.

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Presentation material presented at the poster session must be substantively identical to that described in the abstract. In particular, the title, authorship, and scientific content of the presentation at the poster session must match that in the abstract.

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The first author should be designated as the presenting author and present the work at the conference. No presentation may be given by an individual who is not an author on the abstract unless prior written approval has been obtained by the presenter from NYSCF.

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Authors may not be listed on an abstract unless they have given their consent to the presenting author. All material must be the work of the authors listed.

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
